■ You can lower your heat bills this winter with free weatherstripping and caulking? Call 221-7430 and ask for the REACH program to find out if you qualify.

■ If you use a life-support system, you can ask Fort Collins Light and Power to notify you in advance of any planned power outages? Call 221-6700.

■ The utility company has emergency numbers for your safety and convenience? Call

221-6700 for light and power emergencies, 221-6589 for stormwater emergencies, and 221-6681 for water and wastewater emergencies.

If an emergency arises after business hours call 221-6710 for light and power problems, and 221-6685 for stormwater, water and wastewater problems.
